



They are questions designed to check that learners have understood the meaning of a piece of grammar, an item of vocabulary or a functional expression. The word 'concept' expresses the meaning of the piece of language.











What are concept-check questions?

Verbum Conceptum

Concept questions usually come in the form of 'Yes/No' answers questions or 'either/or' choice questions.



Do you understand?

Possible reasons why students say 'Yes' when the teacher asks this question.

They think they understand, but don't.

They are too embarrassed to admit they don't.


Why





Teacher explanations do not require students to demonstrate understanding.

Concept-check questions do.



Use when presenting a piece of language and for confirming understanding of that language.





As new language comes up during a lesson and needs checking.

Presentation Sequence

Create a context

Concept check



I had my car repaired.



- I didn't repair my car myself.
- Another person repaired it.
- I arranged for the person to do it for me.
- Did I repair my car? (No)
- Did someone else repair it? (Yes)
- Did I arrange for the person to do it? (Yes)
