


Core values of Asian Americans - family and work ethic - leads to success in work and education

A large proportion of Asian Americans work in self-owned small businesses due to structural inequalities in the market place




Lack of support in achieving places in Ivy League universities

Perception of lack of representation and opportunities for Asian American actors in Hollywood




Negative Impact on Asian American community
